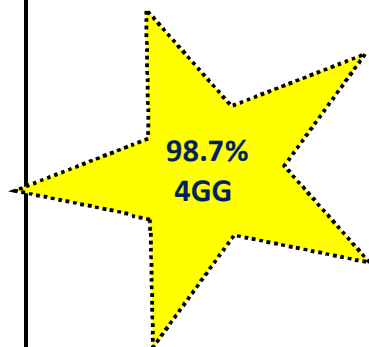

Costumes

Keep all costumes, whether handmade or bought, away from candles or other naked flames.

If clothing catches fire, remember to **STOP, DROP** and **ROLL**

- **STOP** where you are. Do not run.
- **DROP** to the ground. Lie down flat.
- **ROLL** over and over on the ground until the flames are out.

Candles

If using candles, make sure they are out when you leave the room.

Do not use real candles in lanterns and pumpkins, use battery operated lights.

Never leave children alone with candles.

Decorations

Do not make lanterns from plastic bottles / containers. This would be dangerous and could result in burns and cause fire.

Keep decorations away from all naked flames.

BONFIRE NIGHT SAFETY

November 5th may be celebrated with fireworks, but bonfires also feature heavily in celebrations. Northamptonshire Fire and Rescue Service has put together some safety advice to help guide those planning to light their own bonfire.

Bonfire safety tips:

- Position a bonfire away from sheds, fences and trees.
- Before lighting a bonfire, check the structure is sound and does not have small children or animals hiding inside it.
- Never use petrol or paraffin to light a fire. A safer way to light it is to use paper and solid firelighters in two or three places to ensure an even burn.
- Never burn dangerous rubbish such as foam-filled furniture, rubber, aerosols, tins of paint, pressurised gas cylinders, tyres and bottles.
- Materials producing light ash which could blow about, such as corrugated cardboard, are unsuitable for burning.
- Have one person responsible for lighting the fire. That person, and any helpers, should wear suitable clothing such as a substantial outer garment made of wool or other low flammable material and strong boots or shoes.
- Remember to 'stop, drop and roll' if clothing catches fire.
- Have a fire blanket ready in the bonfire area.
