### Northampton Association for the Blind Visit to Year 5 and 6



In the last couple of weeks, Year 5 and 6 had the pleasure of meeting Hugh and Rebecca from NAB Northants who support people with visual impairments. Hugh, who has been blind since the age of 16, spoke to us about the different white canes, the children wore different goggles to simulate different impairments. We tried paying cash blindfolded from a purse and learnt about different technology that can help the blind.

Hugh and Rebecca were amazing, answering all our questions and leaving us amazed and inspired in equal measure.

### Accelerated Reader



In Key Stage 2 we use Accelerated Reader to support, motivate and reward our readers. Many parents have asked about the possibility of monitoring their children's quiz habits at home.

**Accelerated Reader Home Connect** allows you to do this.

Use the url <https://ukhosted8.renlearn.co.uk/1895401/homeconnect> and type in your child's user name and password exactly as they would in school.

This gives a parent view of books read, the levels of book they are reading, how well they have done in their quizzes and how close they are to meeting their target.

There are lots of other ways we use Accelerated reader to challenge our readers. We will send more information in the new year.

## Fairy lights not fairy frights

By now, many of us have transformed our homes into tinsel wonderlands packed with sparkling lights and garlands of festive foliage. But are your decorations safe?

If you are using fairy lights, make sure they are not old and worn. They need to be in good repair.

They should also conform to the British Standard BS EN 60598.

Going out or off up to bed? Make sure your fairy lights are switched off and unplugged.

Remember that Christmas decorations can set alight easily, so please don't attach them to lights or heaters.
