Cheese and tomato pizza with potato footballs and salad

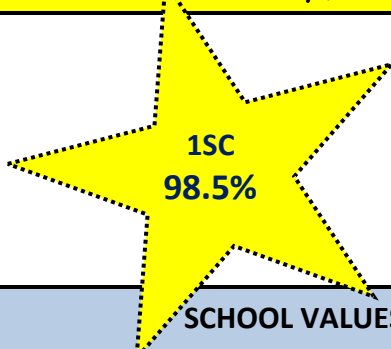
Friday
