


Nursery - Studying at home grid
"What the Ladybird heard"

<p>Literacy Read the story of "What the Ladybird heard" https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Eu9mPX7DuLA</p> <p>Talk about what happened at the beginning, middle and end. Talk about the characters - what were they like?</p>	<p>What noises do the animals on a farm make? Can you tell someone at home? If you are not sure see if you can find out.</p>	<p>Draw a picture of your favourite part of the story and, together, write about what is happening in the picture.</p>
<p>Act out the story - use your farm toys if you have them or you and your family could be the characters!</p>	<p>Practice writing you name using different media such as paint, ink, pencils, in sand etc.</p>	<p>Phonics Learn and practise the sounding and actions of letters - s, a, t, p, i, n, For support in what the letters sound like please look at: Jolly Phonics Sounds and Actions https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=yVyry9jpVjI</p> <p>Hear The Letter Sounds https://www.jollylearning.co.uk/resource-bank-old/learn-the-letter-sounds/</p>
<p>Numeracy Practise recognising, counting and ordering numbers to 5 or 10.</p> <p>Make your own number cards thinking carefully about how to form the numbers.</p>	<p>Paint or draw some dots on a ladybird template. Can you paint 10 dots onto the lady bird?</p>	<p>Match the ladybird's dots to a number. Can you add the correct amount of dots onto the ladybirds (please see below). Can you create your own?</p>
<p>Sorting animals using different categories, e.g. how many legs, fur or feathers, where they live, etc. Use toy animals or pictures of animals.</p>	<p>Can you make your own animal using shapes? E.g. make a ladybird - the body is an oval, the head is a semi-circle, the dots are circles and the legs are rectangles.</p>	<p>I have two leaves. One leaf has 4 ladybirds on it; one leaf has 9 ladybirds on it, which one has the most?</p> <p>Can you repeat this changing the amount of ladybird on the leaves?</p>
<p>Understanding the world Talk about animals that live on a farm.</p> <p>Can you find out some fact about animals on a farm?</p>	<p>Watch some information videos about the animals that live on a farm</p> <p>E.G. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=41jx0Ljy23A "Come Outside" - sheep</p>	<p>Can you match mummy to baby animals? Draw one of the animals and their baby and have a go at labelling... e.g., Pig and piglet</p>
<p>Go on a ladybird hunt! Where do you think ladybirds might live? (They do like stinging nettles, so be careful!)</p>	<p>Find some information about ladybirds.... How many legs do they have? Are they all red with black spots? Do they all have the same number of spots?</p>	<p>What do the animals give us? e.g. Cows give us milk Sheep give us wool Can you draw some pictures e.g. a cow and a glass of milk a sheep and a jumper</p>
<p>Creative Can you sing "Old McDonald had a farm"? See how many different animals you can think of - ask your family to choose an animal for each verse. You can make it as funny as you want ☺</p>	<p>Listen to the song about "What the Ladybird heard"</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=7NbyiDpY6Ww</p> <p>Can you join in with the chorus?</p>	<p>Can you make your own farm yard and animals? You could make these out of Lego bricks, Duplo, stickle brick or any construction toys. And if you don't have any why not try some boxes, yogurt pots and any other junk modelling from around the home.</p>
<p>Art There are lots of different ways to make a ladybird.... You could do some potato printing - cut a potato in half and dip it in red paint. Print it on some paper and then you can add some black spots, eyes and antennae.</p>	<p>Paper plate ladybirds - paint or colour the paper plate and then cut out spots from black paper. You could even add some googly eyes! How many spots will your ladybird have?</p>	<p>You could also draw or paint some of the animals that live on the farm. Which is your favourite animal?</p>
